# Bernardo Siles at Gallery Plan b

Bolivian architect and painter's hard-edged, cool-colored work seems more Washingtonian than Latin.

## **Bernardo Siles**

Architect and painter Bernardo Siles is originally from Bolivia, but

the hard-edged, cool-colored work he's showing at Gallery Plan b seems more Washingtonian than Latin. That's especially true of his most arresting pictures, which leave areas of the canvas white, suggesting the compositions of Morris Louis and Color School colleague Kenneth Noland.

Unlike those precursors, Siles works in oil, not acrylic, and doesn't let the pigments flow. He crafts oblique patterns of near-parallel color bands, mostly in blue, green and gray. The colors sometimes appear to overlap, melding into a different hue at the intersection. These minimalist paintings, identified simply by number, don't have a lot of energy. But they are calm and cooling, like a trickle of water through a moss garden.
